- Effective against anti-coagulant resistant rats and mice.

Just One Bite[®] II

- The active ingredient is bromadiolone, a second-generation anticoagulant that causes excessive bleeding.
- Norway rats, roof rats and house mice usually consume a lethal dose in a single feeding.
- Death is delayed 4 to 5 days, so there's no bait shyness.
- Kills warfarin-resistant Norway rats.

For heavy infestations, give rats and mice the 1-2 punch.

1. Purge heavy infestations with Just One Bite[®] EX place packs or bait blocks.
2. Persist with Just One Bite[®] II products to prevent reinfestation and maintain ongoing control.

Popular problem-causing rodents

House Mouse

- Often found indoors
- Contaminates food with fur and feces

Roof Rat

- Found indoors and out, in trees, on roofs and in attics
- Feeds above the ground

Norway Rat

- Found indoors and out, in rubbish, wood piles and building foundations
- Likes to live in basements and ground floors

Worried you might have rats or mice? Look for these signs...

- Rodent droppings. Oblong-shaped and dark in color. About the size of a grain of rice.
- Tracks and tail drag marks through dust and dirt.
- Greasy rub marks on walls from rodents running along their route.
- Household pets excitedly pawing at cabinets or under appliances.
- Scampering and scratching noises coming from the walls and ceiling at night.
- Chew marks on boxes, wires, packaged goods and around pipes, ducts and vents.
- Rodent burrows and nests outside of buildings.
